Dear Colleagues:

I recently returned from an AIPS sponsored trip to Pakistan (Dec. 11-25, 2015) where I participated in a number of activities that help further Pakistan studies. The impetus for the trip was an invitation to participate in a two-day workshop at the Lahore School of Economics by faculty in their department of Environment and Policy. This group has been conducting innovative interdisciplinary research on small towns in the Punjab, and I helped organize a workshop on this theme by assembling reading materials, engaging with faculty and graduate students at a day long presentation of their research work, presenting a well-attended public lecture at the Gulberg facility, and accompanying the LSE group on a brief fieldwork excursion. While in Lahore, I was also invited to deliver a lecture to the National College of Arts, which was also well attended. I also visited three potential properties in the city under consideration as the new Lahore center. Finally, I was interviewed by *Herald* magazine for a profile scheduled for publication this coming February. The interview was about my understanding of the architectural discipline, current urbanization issues in Pakistan, and university pedagogy.

In Islamabad I accompanied Farina Mir on a visit to the National Documentation Center, where we met with the new director and toured their library and digitizing facility. I also attended a dinner meeting with members of Pakistan's HEC where we discussed needs in humanities education in Pakistan in particular (I subsequently met with the newly appointed director of the HEC in Lahore, discussing this and other issues). I attended a meeting with the cultural attaché of the US consulate and her staff at the Islamabad guesthouse. And finally, I visited and wrote an assessment of three potential properties in Islamabad under consideration as the new center.

I am grateful to AIPS for making all of these activities possible by helping facilitate meetings and by funding my travel and stay expenses. I would also like to extend my gratitude and appreciation for the expert assistance provided by the AIPS driver who accompanied us throughout the journey. I found the Pakistan staff and facilities to be in excellent form.
